


Fig. 1 is an elevational view of a closure cap for a writing instrument, showing my new design;

Fig. 2 is an elevational view thereof taken at right angles to that of Fig. 1;

Fig. 3 is another elevational view thereof taken at an angle intermediate those of Figs. 1 and 2; and

Fig. 4 is a bottom plan view thereof looking in the direction of the arrows 4—4 of Fig. 2.

The sides opposite to those shown in Figs. 1 and 2 are substantially the same in appearance as those shown in Figs. 1 and 2. The drawing has been stippled in parts to indicate contrast.

I claim:

The ornamental design for a closure cap for a writing instrument, as shown and described.
